## Thursday, September 15, 6:30pm, In-Person The Streets of Detroit

When Detroit was founded in 1701 it had only 3 streets, all named after saints. There are now 2306 streets in Detroit. Many have mundane names or names created by developers, but other street names tell the history of the city, names of presidents, land owners, politicians, civil rights icons, soft drinks, and one man whose name is memorialized in a cemetery's name today.

## Wednesday, September 21, 6:30pm, In-Person General Emergency Prep w/Livingston County Health Dept

Lindsay Gestro, Emergency Preparedness Coordinator for the Livingston County Health Department, will discuss the basics of general preparedness such as building an emergency kit, making a plan, and staying informed.

## Thursday, September 29, 6:30pm, In-Person Japanese Air Balloons Over MI During WWII

Between November 1944 and April 1945, Japan attacked the mainland of North America to drop incendiaries and explosives on the Pacific Northwest. Ultimately only 300 balloons were discovered with the furthest destination of the balloons being Michigan. This talk will discuss general attacks, followed by a detailed description of the two balloons which were discovered at the border area of Kent & Allegan counties and in Farmington in the Detroit suburbs.





socialite who talked her way into Special Operations Executive, the spy organization dubbed Winston Churchill's




"Ministry of Ungentlemanly Warfare." She became the first Allied woman deployed behind enemy lines.
