MURDER MYSTERY PARTY**Last Stop: Murder****Friday, March 23, 7:00pm, \$5/person**

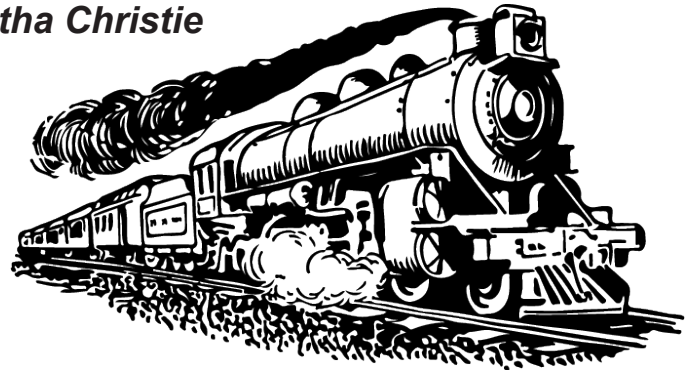
