

The Happiness Project by Gretchen Rubin

Before writing The Happiness Project: Or, Why I Spent a Year Trying to Sing in the

Morning, Clean My Closets, Fight Right, Read Aristotle, and Generally Have More Fun, Gretchen Rubin had an epiphany one rainy afternoon in the unlikeliest of places: a city bus. "The days are long, but the years are short," she realized. "Time is passing, and I'm not focusing enough on the things that really matter." In that moment, she decided to dedicate a year to her happiness project.

In this lively and compelling account now updated with new material by the author—Rubin chronicles her adventures during the twelve months she spent testdriving the wisdom of the ages, current scientific research, and lessons from popular culture about how to be happier.

The Indigo Girl by Natasha Boyd

The story, based on true events, is of an unconventional young woman who, left in

charge of her father's plantations, works humanely with the slaves to grow and harvest lucrative indigo dye that ends up shaping the economy of the American colonial south.

Upon hearing how much the French pay for indigo dye, Eliza believes it's the key to their salvation. But everyone tells her it's impossible, and no one will share the secret to making it. Thwarted at nearly every turn, even by her own family, Eliza finds that her only allies are an aging horticulturist, a married gentleman lawyer, and a slave with whom she strikes a dangerous deal: teach her the intricate thousand-year-old secret process of making indigo dye and she will teach the slaves to read.

Rebecca is a young artist seeking solace and inspiration in

the Mediterranean heat of Athens.

George has come to Athens to learn ancient languages. He has no close relationships with anyone and spends his days hunched over books or wandering the city in a drunken stupor.

Henry is in Athens to dig. An accomplished young archaeologist, he uncovers the city's past as a way to escape his own.

...And then, with a series of chance meetings, Rebecca, George, and Henry are suddenly in flight, their lives brighter and clearer than ever, as they fall headlong into a summer that will forever define them in the decades to come.

- 6. **EXTRAS:** Complete one bingo line (Up, Down, Diagonal, NO FOUR CORNERS) to receive one entry, or cover the whole card to receive three entries, into our End Party Gift Card drawing.
