The library staff has been hard at work throughout the fall months to develop and test out several new programs. New online services will be added in the summer months, and we will be sure to update you when that happens. We hope you take advantage of these new services and that they meet your needs, both educational and recreational. Staffing

We look forward to welcoming two additional staff members, with a start date of early February.


